INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT NASHVILLE AND FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE

Nearly everyone thinks of the Grand Ole Opry when they think about Nashville. Did you know that the ORIGINAL Opry started as a radio show in 1925, and then, when they decided to have a live audience, it was held in a former church, later known as the Ryman Auditorium? The current Grand Ole Opry House was opened in 1978. There are so many folks who got their start as country music stars after performing there!

Also, in order to be a member of the Opry as a performer, you must commit to performing if you are in Nashville for any length of time! That is why the Opry doesn't publish a schedule of performers until a few weeks in advance!

Franklin, Tennessee is also known for being part of the battle sites for the Civil War. We will have the opportunity to visit multiple homes where families hid while battles raged around them!

And there will be plenty of opportunity to spend on Broadway, home to dozens of live music venues where you can pop in for a beverage and listen to up-and-coming performers!

There is the Parthenon, built to scale such as the one you would find in Greece, with a statue of the Greek Goddess Athena and the Centennial Park surrounding it; The Hermitage, former home of President Andrew Jackson and the beautiful memorial gardens where his beloved wife was buried; the Johnny Cash Museum, the Patsy Cline Museum, and the 5th and Broad Food Court!
